Registrar's Report

As club registrar it was my role to collect the paper work and money, check the ID's, put all the details into the computer system and send it off to the association so we can get the ID cards we need to play.

This year we had 201 registered players in 15 teams, though not all of these registered players were actually playing at the end of the season (some had left the area, others just decided not to continue playing). This was a dramatic improvement after a couple of lean years, and it felt like quite a different club this year with multiple Adult teams and our first all age Grand finalists since I joined the club in 2005. I got to referee the U10s and U11s a fair bit and enjoyed seeing the way both teams developed into strong teams who worked well together, playing fair but tough football, and that was a common thread I could see through the young teams.

One significant characteristic of our community is that it experiences a lot of change and this is reflected in our club, causing the large turnover in players and teams. Another characteristic is the varied background of our community, which I see in the details on the birth certificates I collect for ID purposes. In our 201 players, we probably have players from at least 30 different backgrounds. The breakdown of new and returning players is shown below

Includes players who returned to the club but whilst they did not play last year, they have not played anywhere else since leaving us. So they are not considered new to the club.

The number of players new to the club is a little higher this year than the normal 50%, but is actually amazingly low given the big expansion in teams and players this year, with our U11, U21 and all 4 AAM teams being new teams. Part of that is due to some teams having had very higher return rates, I believe we got about 70% of last year's players back. Also, whilst the U21/2 and AAM/6 teams were not playing last year, some of the players in those teams last played with us.

Registration for next year will start on-line from mid-January, and at the club house (or it temporarily replacement) through Saturdays in February. *One important point for next year; register as early as possible so we can be sure you have a team! We were very lucky that there was a spot in the competition to put the U11s – late registrations can cause problems. Please register by mid February 2015!*



PLAYER OF THE YEAR



The **Bill Henderson Player of the Year Award** – in honor of a great man, a true gentleman, who played for our club as a junior between 1944-47 and then went on to become a Soccerroo in 1953 and an Olyroo in 1956.

So how to decide the winner?

Is it the club's fairest player? Not necessarily, though the committee decided that a player who has received a red card, whilst it does not disqualify that player from winning the award, it would make it extremely difficult.

- 5 points deducted for every red card
